SOCIAL ECONOMY: AN SPECIFIC FIELD

Social Economy:

- Part of a plural economy
- Activities and organizations that are democratically governed and not for profit – oriented

An economic field in expansion around the world

- It represents jobs, essential economic and social activities
- Aims at mutual and general interest goals
- Recent new attention from national and international authorities in the context of the global crisis (financial, economic, social, ecological)

- UNRISD (2012-2015)

Scientific Events

Publications

Transformations of the context:

Transformations of the SE:

- → New waves of SE initiative
- → New forms of SE organizations
- → Social innovation + technological innovation
- → Evolution of institutionalized SE ("coopitalism")
- → New initiatives outside SE
- → International networking of SE actors

- → Social and technological innovations
- → Sustainable growth and development
- → Existing and New SE ecosystems

Research methods and conceptualization

- → Codification of new social innovations in the SE
- → Quantitative analysis, international comparison
- → Measurement of the SE sector and impacts
- → Partnership research with SE actors
